A curious set of events at last weeks pay talks.

LUL asked for the unions to meet at Acas for a revised pay offer to be put to them, in view of the Night Tube implementation fiasco the linked deal had to be adjusted.

No sooner had the meeting started when they promptly said we will write to you with a revised pay offer.

No talks, no negotiations.

It is good to talk we are told and are often accused of walking out of these talks.

We have never "walked out!"

As yet no details have been forwarded to the RMT - we are waiting

The pay deal ended in April 2015

We are now approaching December.

OBLIQUE IMAGE PROBLEMS ON JNP/BCV

On BCV and JNP a significant number of platforms have been identified, by the respective line PTI groups, to display oblique images.

The TUs have insisted that the Company apply a process to ensure passenger safety with those platforms with oblique images being staffed to provide assisted dispatch; until a long-term solution has been identified, agreed, and implemented.

After LU rejected this demand they were advised that their lack of action was unacceptable.

The TUs informed them that they would provide train operators with a list of locations where assisted dispatch should be requested before departure from the station.

Information on Line specific locations, which has been compiled by the line PTI representatives.

Fit for the future Stations



We will not accept a new framework unless it meets our concerns.

LU suggests all station staff will be asked to sign a new employment contract

LU has said that only the Kings Cross, Central Line East and Leytonstone cover groups will 'go live' with Fit for the Future (FftF) in February. All other areas will go live in April.

This leaves little time to revise our agreements but RMT will not be forced into any agreement that does not suit members. The framework and T&P are negotiated documents and we will not agree unacceptable changes
