What happened at the last branch meeting?

Regional Organiser Election and nominations

At the last Branch meeting after lively debate Unjum Murza was given the nomination of our branch for the Regional Organiser position. The Election will be taking place soon and you are urged to vote for your choice for this important position

Trains rep DE recognition This issue was discussed and it was the decision of the branch that London Underground management had no place interfering with the unions democratic process and that Jason Moriarty was the rep regardless of any silliness from outside the RMT. The branch decided that Jason Moriarty would be supported 100% as rep.

Branch AGM It was announced that due to the Christmas break the branch AGM would be held at the November branch meeting day on the 29th of November at the usual time of 16.00hrs after the branch business is concluded we will be retiring to the bar.

Other issues discussed included New rule book 23 (incompatible train movements), Wheelchair ramps, Probationary interview problems on the Stratford group and others.

London Underground needs to scrap plans for driverless trains <u>PERMANENTLY</u> after safety concerns

Following the threat of industrial action LUL have stated that they will not be testing driverless trains any time soon, however many are skeptical and have good right to be.

The fact that these announcements have been made does not mean the threat to jobs and safety has gone away.

Philippa Oldham, who is head of transport and manufacturing at the Institution of Mechanical Engineers, said "The secrecy so far about the move towards driverless trains only adds to the fear that LU is being driven by ideology more than anything else on this issue." She also said "London Underground drivers do a fantastic job and fortunately accidents due to driver error are very rare".

There have been several Incidents recently which would undoubtedly resulted in deaths if the acts of professional trained drivers had not prevented possible fatalities occurring.

This is not a time to bury your head in the sand or feel secure about the future of the train operator grade, the threat is still real.
