

The NEC has instructed members to take the following action short of strike

From 00:01 hours on Wednesday 2nd February 2022, all members are instructed:

- Not to familiarise staff who do not usually work at a location
- No training of staff for roles that are outside of their normal substantive role
- No undertaking of training that is outside of a member's normal substantive role

RMT reps will now meet to discuss what further action we should take and the NEC will consider the matter following the meeting of reps. Before the pandemic tube-workers were generating £300m a day in value for the London economy. That's £17,500 a shift for every member of LU staff. London needs a carbon free transport system to recover from the pandemic.

During the pandemic we were heroes keeping the service running. Now we're just a cost that needs to be cut

RMT demands:

- No job cuts
- No detrimental changes to our pensions
- No changes to our main or other agreements. We will not accept flexible working that destroys our work/life balance.

A meeting for all Level1/Tier1/Level2/Tier 2 reps has been called to discuss what action we will now take to defend our pensions, jobs and agreements. All reps should try to attend.
