TfL has told us that emergency funding has now been agreed up to 24 June this year. In return for this funding TfL has undertaken to consider a further £400m of cuts. That is on top of existing cuts which include £508m on London Underground by March 2023.

#### LU management confirm threat to all grades at ACAS

At ACAS this week your functional representatives and regional organiser asked LU management to confirm that they expect the 600 job cuts on stations to save around £25m. Management did confirm this and told us that the remaining £483m would be found by carrying out the same process of seeking cuts in every area of expenditure across every function.

They have a target of saving of £100m from our pensions and will look for job cuts and flexible working as they try and achieve the impossible demand of self funding TfL by March 2023.
